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Summary	SLSNSW is calling for nominations from accredited coaches wishing to be appointed as Coach for one of four NSW teams competing in the Super Surf Teams League (SSTL) for 2022-23

INTRODUCTION

SLSNSW will be entering four teams into the 2023 Super Surf Teams League (SSTL). Athletes will be selected based on regions in one of the following four teams: NSW Country Dolphins, Hunter Central Coast Orcas, Sydney Northern Beaches Rays and Sydney Illawarra Sharks.

SLSNSW is seeking nominations for Coach roles to lead the four NSW based teams in the 2023 Super Surf Teams League. These positions will be supported by NSW Head Coach Jimmy Walker.

SCHEDULE

The SSTL will be held at Maroubra SLSC, across three rounds from 13 – 15 January 2023.

COACH ROLE

The roles available for the Super Surf Team League are:

- Coach (x4) – will expire 28 days after the last round of the 2023 Super Surf Teams League.

Requirements of Coach:

- All nominees must be current financial members
- Current SLSA Development Coach Accreditation or higher
- Willing to undertake a Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- Comprehensive knowledge of Surf Sports competition and rules

- Previous touring experience
- Current First Aid certificate
- Demonstrated ability to think innovatively and strategically
- Highly motivated and passionate in enhancing the success of NSW athletes
- Lead Coach will also undertake chaperone responsibilities
- Compile a report within three weeks of completing last round
- Assist with organising various training sessions team within the appointment period
- Report to NSW Surf Interstate Lead Coach (may also be a SSSL Coach)
- Coaches will be responsible for team configuration and coordinating athletes on the day of competition and Round to Round in consultation with the Lead Coach
- Coaches for all 5 teams shall work together on logistics for athletes and function as a wider NSW group.

COST

All (if any) travel and all accommodation costs are the responsibility of the individual including making arrangements.

SLSNSW may allocate a subsidy to reflect cost involved with being involved in the SSSL.

We do however require coaches nominating to do so understanding they will be responsible for the majority of their travel costs.

How to Nominate:

1. All Team Management will be required to comply with the guidelines and expectations set out in Selection Policy and Athlete & Management Agreement.

E-Learning:

All successful athletes and team management members will be required to complete both the ASADA Level 1 and Level 2 Anti-Doping and also Match Fixing e-learning courses. These courses are free of charge and provide an opportunity to develop a knowledge and understanding of anti-doping and match fixing in sport. Moving forward, SLSNSW strongly believe this is a great additive to the structure of any touring team and/or squad and is vital for elite competition and athlete development.

SLSNSW fully supports the new SLSA Anti-Doping and Match Fixing policies (SLSA Members Area). Following the completion of each course, a completion certificate/email must be forwarded to Surfsports@surflifesaving.com.au SLSNSW have organised with SLSA to have these courses uploaded on to SurfGuard as an award. Once completed, the courses do not have to be completed again, unless there is an update in information from the organisations.
