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#### Introduction

SLSNSW is seeking Expressions of Interest from Clubs who may be interested in hosting a round of the 2025 NSW Sharkskin IRB Premiership Series and/or the 2025 NSW Sharkskin IRB State Championship.

The NSW IRB competition attracts around 350-450 competitors, 60+ officials and supporters during Autumn and Winter.

## **Background Information**

The NSW Sharkskin IRB Premiership and NSW Sharkskin State Championship provide SLSNSW members the opportunity to compete against IRB teams from across the State.

The five competition disciplines include;

- IRB Rescue
- IRB Mass Rescue
- IRB Teams Rescue

The final competition divisions and event format to be confirmed.

- IRB Tube Rescue
- IRB Relay

#### **Host Club Benefits**

As the host venue, your club receives a range of benefits for hosting this event in your local region.

#### Club Culture

Hosting an IRB event provides your members with the opportunity to enhance comradery and pride in the club. Often host clubs use this opportunity draw on a wider pool of volunteers to engage in the club over the autumn and winter months and breathe life into the club facilities at a traditionally 'quiet' time of year.

#### Local and State Profile

As part of the IRB Competition Series, your club will be promoted to the wider network of clubs in anticipation of the event. Furthermore, media exposure is possible along with social media generated by SLSNSW. This is an opportunity to showcase your club both within and external to surf life saving.

#### Host Fee

SLSNSW will provide a hosting fee to the club for provision of services defined in a hosting MOU. This includes administrative delivery, facilities and equipment, volunteer personnel and event support. Indicative host fee is \$1200.00 per day.

#### Officials Catering

SLSNSW provides the host club with the opportunity to cater for 60+ officials for breakfast, morning tea, lunch and debrief. SLSNSW meets the cost for officials catering to \$24.00 incl GST per official per day.

#### Refreshments

At the conclusion of competition, your club can operate a club bar (within your current liquor licence) to serve officials, competitors, and supporters.

#### **BBQ**

Your club could leverage from 350+ competitors, 60+ officials and 100+ supporters to operate a BBQ fundraiser for the duration of competition, in a prime position.

#### **Local Council Support**

Successful host clubs may be able to access local event grants and may be required to assist SLSNSW with funding applications to local councils or other organisations to reduce costs where possible.



#### **Schedule and Format**

The 2025 IRB Premiership Series will ideally be conducted over four (4) rounds allowing for a maximum of two (2) full days for competition per round.

Please note SLSNSW reserves the right to amend/modify any of the below schedule (e.g., A round may be reduced to one (1) day of competition, include two (2) rounds on one (1) weekend or the format may be a stand-alone IRB competition) with reasonable notice to the host club.

#### Round 1: Saturday 3 May & Sunday 4 May 2025

2-day event with a 0745-0800 start on both days with a finish of 1600 (unless completed earlier).
Scrutineering may be included in this round on Friday.

#### Round 2: Saturday 17 May & Sunday 18 May 2025

o 2-day event with a 0745-0800 start on both days with a finish of 1600 (unless completed earlier).

#### Round 3: Saturday 31 May & Sunday 1 June 2025

o 2-day event with a 0745-0800 start on both days with a finish of 1600 (unless completed earlier).

#### Round 4: Saturday 14 June & Sunday 15 June 2025

o 2-day event with a 0745-0800 start on both days with a finish of 1600 (unless completed earlier).

#### State Championships: Friday 27 June – Sunday 29 June 2025

3-day event with a 0745-0800 start on both days with a finish of 1600 (unless completed earlier).
Scrutineering will be conducted on Friday morning. Racing to commence Friday afternoon.

## **Venue & Event Requirements**

The successful venue will be required to address the following criteria: A checklist is provided at the end of this circular. Please provide any supporting attachments with the EOI.

## 1. On Beach

Minimum accessible beach of 400m, including the following:

2.3	First Aid area		Must have direct access to the beach. This may be part of the existing clubhouse.
2.4	Sufficient plumbing located at the venue		Wash down area for IRBs
2.5	Public Toilets		One (1) per 100 people
2.6	Scrutineering site	Minimum 50 sq./m space	Consideration to fresh water supply
2.7	Sponsor activation area	6x4m	Close to competition area

## 3. Contingency Location

3.1	The proposed alternative venues should face a different direction and prevailing conditions to that of the main venue
3.2	Two (2) alternative locations should be nominated, meeting similar requirements of the proposed venue, i.e., minimum length of 300m, or flat-water venue with minimum length 200m
3.3	Include maps of the proposed alternative venues
3.4	Sufficient access for vehicles
3.5	Water quality suitable for swimming
3.6	All successful venues will need to be available to host the Back Up Round if required

## 4. Other Logistical Requirements

4.1	Accessible to adequate emergency services including hospital and ambulance service
4.2	Access to medical, pharmaceutical, dental, physio and chiropractic services
4.3	The venue must be available to SLSNSW from Friday 3pm prior to the event prior to the event until two (2) hours after the completion of last race
4.4	A designated car park and/or on street parking of 50 spaces; (includes officials and 30x IRB Trailers)
4.5	Provide an overview of facilities in the area including shopping centres, entertainment facilities, public transport, and accommodation
4.6	Pencil booked all IRB dates with Council

## 5. Essential Criteria

5.1	One (1) nominated key organising contact
5.2	A minimum of five (5) fully operational IRBs (including 2-stroke motors only), two (2) for judging and three (3) for duty/patient boats.
5.2a	Provision of 40 plastic chairs
5.3	High & low tide times must be stated for the nominated event
5.4	Available accommodation within a reasonable distance from the venue
5.5	Public viewing areas
5.6	Proximity to a shopping complex
5.7	A suitable contingency venue with sufficient beach and a flat-water venue in the event of unfavourable sea conditions (within a reasonable distance from the proposed venue)
5.8	Local Government support (i.e., pencil booking dates). The Council special event application must be completed by the host Club in consultation with SLSNSW after successful EOI advised.
5.10	Provide officials catering for the carnival (approx. 60)
5.11	Provide First Aid equipment and consumables.
5.12	A minimum of two (2) ATV/4WD vehicles as required for the event
5.13	Sufficient trailer and car parking. Minimum 50 car parks for IRB Trailers and officials
5.14	Club and Branch endorsement
5.15	Detailed map outlining the site layout and alternate site layout

## Other items that will be required for consideration include,

6.2	Suitable wash down area	
6.3	Craft scrutineering and gear storage area with considerations for large numbers of craft, motors, and competitors	

6.4	Sufficient workforce for the duration of the event (10x minimum)	
6.5	Four (4) tents and star pickets (6x4m patient marshal tent with walls, 3x3m video recorders tent, 3x3m first aid tent, 3x3m back up administration tent)	
6.6	Waste and recycling bins with regular cleaning	
6.7	Team Managers and officials briefing / debrief areas (25+ Team Managers and approx. 60 officials)	
6.8	Power supply	
6.9	Drinking water	
6.10	Provision of hot foods in case of cold weather / water	
6.11	Nearby public or other toilet facilities	
6.12	Public address equipment

Clubs must also contact their Council to provide notification that a Surf Life Saving competition could be staged on the nominated dates. This is to avoid any event clashes with any other beach users/event organisers. A formal Event Application will need to be submitted to Council by successful Host Clubs.

The EOI addressing the criteria is due to Surf Life Saving NSW by **Wednesday 19 June 2024.** Please note that the EOI requires endorsement by the Branch.
