SLSNSW is calling for expressions of interest (EOIs) from athletes seeking selection in the 2024-25 NSW Surf Interstate Pathway Squad, with the final team to be selected and compete at the SLSA Pathway Surf Interstate Championships on Tuesday 1 April 2025 at North Kirra SLSC and Tugun SLSC.

Surf Interstate Squad

The 2024-25 Surf Interstate Pathway Squad will comprise of approximately 30 athletes based upon relevant past performances and results. The NSW Selection Panel have nominated the following carnivals as selection events and will consider other relevant results.

Note: Athletes may be selected from outside the squad if results warrant selection.

- Avoca Surf Slam, 23 November 2024
- Interbranch Championships, 30 November 1 December 2024

Team Composition

The 2024-25 SLSA Pathway Surf Interstate Championships will hold the Pathway division of competition with a total team size of 16 athletes:

- Each Pathway Team will consist of 8 male and 8 female competitors. To be eligible for a
 Pathway State team a member must be a minimum age of 13 years as of 30 September 2024
 (i.e. Under 14 age group) or a minimum age of 14 years as of 30 September 2024 (i.e. Under
 15 age group). Each Pathway State team will consist of a maximum of 8 male and 8 female
 competitive members from the U14 and U15 age categories only.
- Competitors must compete for the whole of the Championships in the Pathway
 Competition. They are not permitted to compete outside of their chosen division.

Levy

Please be advised that a levy may be payable for all successful team members to assist with the cost of the team (i.e. uniform etc.). Clubs will be invoiced for this levy and it will then be up to the club to pass on this expense to the individual athlete.

How to Nominate

- All nominating members are asked to familiarise themselves with the <u>SLSNSW Selection</u>
 <u>Policy</u> and the <u>SLSNSW Athlete Agreement</u>. All athletes will be required to comply with the
 guidelines and expectations set out in these documents.
- Complete the <u>Online Nomination Form</u> by Sunday 10 November 2024
- All nominees must be current financial members and proficient with their relevant awards. All nominations must be endorsed by Club representatives.
- After the close of nominations, Branch will be sent all nominations from within their Branch.
 Branch will then be required to provide endorsement for nominations to SLSNSW within 48
 hours. Individuals are not required to seek a letter from Branch prior to nomination. If
 Branch does not endorse the nomination, it will be the responsibility of the Branch to
 communicate this to the member.
- Bronze of Origin: athletes who have transferred to an Interstate SLSC are eligible to nominate for NSW team selection if they originally completed their Bronze Medallion in NSW, under the 'Bronze of Origin' guidelines. Endorsements from both your current club and original NSW club are required prior to selection.

Match Fixing and Anti-Doping

- The SLSA National Policy on Match Fixing and framework covers all SLS Events that are
 conducted by SLSA, State Centres, Branches and Clubs including special events, conducted
 by third parties sanctioned by an SLS entity and any event, competition or series connected
 with Surf Lifesaving. Please refer to Policy Document 5.11 for further details.
- Members have responsibilities under Policy 5.2 Anti-Doping Policy and Policy 6.23 Illicit
 Drugs in Sport (both available online in the SLSA Members Portal). It is strongly
 recommended that all athletes complete the online Sports Integrity Australia training
 module AND conduct at least one (1) anti-doping education activity with all competitors
