Subject : Patrol Hour Exemption Process to meet eligibility requirements to compete in Championship Events			

Dear Directors of Surf Sports & Directors of Lifesaving,

SLSNSW has in place a NSW specific provision to SLSA policy 5.04 in relation to service hours which are allowed to be utilised in conjunction with patrol hours in order to meet the 25-hour annual patrol hour requirement to compete in Championships events. These variations are described in the <u>SLSNSW Regulations</u>.

Under Regulation (5dii) which was approved in December 2023, members who partake in the following SLS activities may also apply for exemption of up to a **maximum** of 10 patrol hours to take their total patrol hour requirement to 25 hours:


- Club Executive Committee members
- Accredited Club Coaches (unpaid)
- Club Training Officers and assessors
- Voluntary rostered, substitute, voluntary patrol hours
- Support Operations personnel (as per the on-duty hours logged against the member),
- Water Safety at club and intra club activities and special events (as per hours undertaken by the member and evidenced by official event documentation. (These hours must be logged at the time of the activity)

A minimum of 15 hours must be undertaken on patrol. Any patrol or water safety hours not logged at the time of the activity will not be counted.

Any member who is seeking an exemption in order from them to qualify for Championship Events, must seek an exemption via the exemption process. All submissions must be received at SLSNSW by the closing date, which can be found in each Event Entry Circular. After the closing date, the requests will be reviewed by the SLSNSW Director of Lifesaving (who in consultation with the SLSNSW Chair Surf Sports Standing Committee) will make a determination of the request.

Please note that where a member has undertaken water safety and that activity has already been logged as patrol hours in the patrol log, those hours cannot be used again for the purpose of this Regulation.

Members seeking exemption are to follow the exemption process outlined below.



Note: All requests must be submitted by Branches only, to <u>bcooper@surflifesaving.com.au</u>. Only forms submitted via this process will be reviewed. No forms will be accepted after the closing date, which is detailed in the relevant Event Entry Circular.
